UKI Agility Stakes Final Bye Requirements

Qualification Period Oct 1, 2021 – July 31, 2022

- **3 Agility clear rounds** – (minimum of 12 level Agility points)
 - **3 Jumping clear rounds** – (minimum of 12 Jumping level points)
 - **1 Games clear round** – (minimum of 4 Games level points)
 - **1 Speedstakes clear round** – (minimum of 4 Speedstakes level points)
- Video Home Trial Runs can be used but count as a half of one run. (2 level points)

- Please send the filled out tracker pages with all necessary information. Do not send partial information. If you are even 1 class short, this does not constitute a Bye and therefore should not be sent as it will be deleted.
- The tracker is a fillable PDF. We urge you to type in the information so that it can be sent as a pdf that is clear and can easily be emailed. Pictures and scans will not be accepted if the file is too large to download or too poor in quality to read.

- Once your information has been received, you will receive an email with receipt of the tracker within 72 hours. If you have not heard back from us after 72 hours, we have not received it. - Failure to submit this information by the qualifying deadline of July 31 and not receiving a confirmation from us, will void the bye you may have gained. No exceptions.

> **Measuring**

If you are a UKI member who has been measured at UKI trials you do not need a further measurement. If you have not been measured and you have a permanent height card with an **actual measurement** from another organization, please scan a copy & email ukiusopen.info@gmail.com or bring with you to check-in. All dogs without a UKI measurement or a height card as stated above, must attend check in and be measured between 3pm & 5pm on Wednesday. No other measuring session will take place. Failure to provide a measure or attend the measuring session will eliminate you from the whole event with no refund.

WCO Agility	One off Agility class with individual result.
Winner Takes All Jumping	Fast Jumping course. Cash prizes for winners!
Speedstakes Challenge	Two Speedstakes rounds which are NOT combined. Rd 1 is the qualifying round for the second round, which is the Speedstakes Final.
Pentathlon	Consists of 2 jumping, 2 agility and 1 Pentathlon Steeplechase round. Faults converted into time. 5 faults = 3 seconds
UKI Stakes	Jumping round and an Agility round which are NOT combined. Rd 1 is the Jumping round, qualifying for the Agility Final. Byes can also be used to qualify straight into the Agility Final.
Games Challenge	Snooker round and Gamblers round with the results combined.
West Coast Masters	Agility round and a Jumping round with results combined. Faults converted into time. 5 faults = 3 seconds
Bonus Steeplechase	A one-off round for those that have run in the Pentathlon and the UKI Stakes Jumping but have not made it into either the Pentathlon Steeplechase or the UKI Stakes Agility Final. The winner of this class gains a place in the UKI Stakes Agility Final.

General Competition Rules

- Entry is open to everyone, in all classes except Bonus Steeplechase, with no pre-qualification necessary.
- This event is open to all dogs and handlers irrespective of their level in UKI.
- Dogs and handlers must register with UKI.
- Each class has a separate competition for each jump height.
- Dogs may only compete in one height throughout the whole event.
- Dogs may only compete with one handler through the entire event.
- Handlers who have earned a bye into the UKI Stakes, must be the same handler to run at the West Coast Open. If there is a change in handler, all byes or prequalification will be void and unable to be used.
- Classes will be run in strict running order. Running orders will be randomly drawn for the first round of each class. Failure to be at the line for your turn will result in Elimination and unable to run in the class.
- Classes will be run under UKI rules and regulations with additional rules detailed below. Any further amendments will be posted on the UKI web page and Facebook page.
- Progression percentages/cutoff amounts for the second rounds for Speedstakes Final, Gamblers, Pentathlon Speedstakes and UKI Stakes Agility Final will be determined and announced once the show entries are processed.
- In the event of a tie for a progression place both dogs will go through to the next round.
- In the event of a tie for a top 3 overall podium, a runoff will be required.
- In the event of a tie to determine running order in the next round, a coin toss will determine the running order.
- A no-show in any class or any round of a combined class will result in disqualification from that Class, including prizes and awards and further runs in the combined classes.
- Eliminations in classes except where specified below, will receive 50 faults and a 50 second course time.
- No results from this event will go towards the qualifying for any future UKI event and / or count towards UKI level progression.
- NFC and the Repeat & Move On (RMO) are not allowed during any run at the West Coast Open.
- UKI reserves the right to rule at the event on anything not covered in these rules and in any exceptional circumstances. Rule changes will be posted.
- If you have not submitted your byes by the deadline of JULY 31, the bye will be void and unable to be used.
- Masters and Pentathlon will use scoring of 5 faults = 3 seconds.
- Courses may have up to 22 obstacles at this event.
- WCO Show Management is committed to safety and is determined to provide premier equipment, running surface and course design. However, unforeseen situations may arise that are out of our control. By entering this event you accept that you have a personal choice not to run in any class if for any reason you believe there are safety issues due to differing opinions on course design and/or environmental factors. You agree by entering this event that you have no comeback or right for refund on any course you do not wish to run due to course design and/or environmental factors.

Specific Event Rules

Golden Gate Dog Sports Agility

- A UKI Agility class.
- Least faults win with time used as a tie-breaker.

Winner Takes All \$\$ Jumping Sponsored by Agility Gate

- A portion from each entry will go to the prize fund. Winner from each jump height will win the total amount tallied for that jump height.
- Consists of a fast Jumping course.
- Least faults win with time used as a tie-breaker.

Speedstakes Challenge Sponsored by Agility University

- Consists of a qualifying round and a Final. Results are not combined.
- Least faults win with time as the tie-break only.
- Running order for Final will be in reverse order of the first round result.
- A progression percentage or number of dogs to move to the Final will be announced after the show entries close and are processed.
- Eliminations in the qualifying round will not progress to the Final.
- Eliminations in Final will not be placed in the Speedstakes Challenge.

Pentathlon Challenge Sponsored by 4 Legged Flix

- Consists of 2 jumping, 2 agility and 1 Pentathlon Steeplechase round. All dogs will run the first 4 rounds with a random draw for all 4 rounds.
- A progression percentage or number of dogs to move to the Pentathlon Steeplechase will be announced after the show entries close and are processed.
- Scoring is cumulative over all rounds.
- Obstacle faults will be converted into seconds (5 faults = 3 seconds) and time faults added on a 1:1 ratio for all classes in this event.
- An elimination in any Pentathlon class is 50 faults plus dogs that are eliminated will be given a course time of 50 seconds, regardless of the standard course time.
- Running order for the Pentathlon Steeplechase will be the reverse order of placings after the 4th round.
- In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Pentathlon Steeplechase round will decide the winner. If there is still a tie, the results from previous classes will be used in the following order: agility 2, jumping 2, agility 1, jumping 1. If this does not produce an outright winner, there will be a run-off on the Pentathlon Steeplechase course.

Games Challenge Sponsored by The Agility Challenge

- Consists of a Snooker round and a Gamblers round with the results combined.
- Cumulative scoring; highest number of points wins with time as tie breaker only, in all aspects of the Games Challenge.
- Running order for Gamblers will run in reverse order of Snooker results.
- Eliminations (dogs not stopping the timers by going over the finish jump) will score 0 points with 100 seconds as the course time.
- Zero points or an elimination in the Snooker round will not move on to the Gamblers round.
- A progression percentage or number of dogs to move to the Gamblers will be announced after the show entries close and are processed.
- In the event of a tie for the Games Challenge Champion, the scores from the Gamblers round will determine the winner. If there is still a tie in the top 3, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the Gamblers course.

West Coast Masters Sponsored by Agility Pro Shop

- There is no pre-qualification needed to enter this event.

- Consists of an Agility round and a Jumping round with results combined.
- Running order for both classes will be in random order for this event.
- Faults converted into seconds: **5 faults = 3 seconds** and time faults treated the same as course faults but converted on a 1:1 ratio.
- Cumulative scoring; dog with the lowest score wins.
- In the event of a tie for the combined results, the result from the Agility round will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie for a podium place, the dogs will compete in a run-off on the Agility course.
- Eliminations will result in 50 faults with a 50 second course time.
- Dogs that score double elimination will not be placed.
- A portion from each entry will go to the prize fund. Winner from each jump height will win the total amount tallied for that jump height.

UKI Stakes Sponsored by Great Dane Photos

- Consists of a qualifying round and a Final. Results are not combined.
- The qualifying round will be a jumping class with the Final an Agility class.
- Least faults win with time as the tie-break only.
- Running order for Final will be in reverse order of the first round result.
- A progression percentage or number of dogs to move to the Final will be announced after the show entries close and are processed.
- Final Bye earned throughout the year at local UKI trials from Oct 1 2021 – July 31, 2022: To earn an automatic bye into the final, dog and handler partnerships must have earned three (3) Agility clear rounds and three (3) Jumping clear rounds, one (1) Games class qualifying scores (Snooker, Gamblers, Snakes & Ladders, Power & Speed) and one (1) Speedstakes clear rounds. Clear rounds have no time or course faults and can be obtained from current level dog is working at, including Masters Heat classes (not available for Nursery).
- Those with automatic Bye into the Final may still enter the jumping round – the result from the jumping will place your running order in the Final. Elimination or a No show in the Jumping will run 1st in the final. A random draw will take place if there is more than one dog in this position.
- Eliminations in the qualifying round will not progress to the Final.
- Eliminations in Final will not be placed in the final.

Bonus Steeplechase sponsored by Half Moon Bay Dog Sports

- This class will be made up of dogs that ran in the UKI Stakes Jumping AND at least one of the first four rounds of the Pentathlon AND did not progress through to either of the SUNDAY Finals (UKI Stakes Final and Pentathlon Steeplechase).
- Consists of a Steeplechase class that is a one-off round with scores from previous rounds irrelevant.
- Least faults wins with time used as a tie-breaker.
- The winner qualifies to run in the UKI Stakes Agility Final. They will run first in the Final (eliminations will not move forward).

The Pentathlon Steeplechase and Bonus Steeplechase must include 12 (twelve) weave poles and an A-frame, both of which may be taken up to 2 (two) times each. Other obstacles allowed: pipe tunnel, jumps, tyre, spread jumps, wall, and long jump. A dogwalk and seesaw cannot be included.

Schedule and Running Orders

We are anticipating the event will run over 4 full competition days (Thurs–Sunday) with a crating set up and measuring on Wed 3-5 pm. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for measuring and their class and running order. All runs for this event will be in strict running order. **Failure to run in the order assigned will result in elimination.** It is the handler's understanding with multiple dogs that they are entering a competition that does require strict running order and no advantage will be given to these handlers over handlers with only one dog.

The exact class schedule will be determined once the entry has closed and will be posted on the UKI web page and the UKI West Coast Open FB page

Groupings

This event will run under a group system for the majority of the event to help eliminate clashes. There will always be at least one group off per rotation for the purpose of lending a hand to run the rings.

The groups will be created in a random manner with the main goal to achieve an equal number of dogs in each group.

- **FRIENDS & FAMILY** - Competitors have the option to request another fellow competitor be listed in the same group. **This must be submitted at time of entry.** Although there are no guarantees, we will do our very best to accommodate your requests. Those competitors who name each other during this selection will stand a better chance of being grouped together. Please don't assume you will automatically be placed with your spouse, family member or partner if you don't request it.
Requests after the entry close date will not be accepted – sorry, no exceptions.

Managing Conflicts for Handlers with Multiple Dogs in Non Seeded Classes

In the initial classes of each event (non-seeded runs) a random draw will produce the running order. Every attempt will be made for handlers with multiple dogs for running orders of the first round (all unseeded rounds) to have several dogs between each of their dogs by striving to achieve the following:

A gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs) will be created by moving the first-drawn dog earlier in the running order. If this does not achieve a 10-dog gap then the second-drawn dog will be moved down in the running order.

If there are not enough dogs in the class to achieve the 10-dog gap the biggest gap possible will be created. If this gap does not achieve the minimum 10 dog gap, then a break of 5 minutes will be given. The 5-minute countdown will start as the handler's first dog crosses the finish line; the handler must enter the ring with their second dog before the countdown is complete. If a handler has dogs in different height divisions, and the 10 dog gap cannot be achieved, the 5 minutes will run through while the jump heights are being changed. Please be aware, it is not always possible to give multiple dogs within a group the full dog gap. You will not be given more time than explained above.

Multiple dog conflicts in Seeded classes:

In the seeded classes a handler has earned their running order and the advantage this brings. However in previous events the majority of handlers have chosen to create a gap in their running orders. We will therefore automatically move your first dog to a spot earlier in the running order to create a gap of 10 dogs (9 dogs between their runs). If this is unable to be achieved, the 5-minute rule will be used. Handlers who wish to keep their seeded running order must notify the office during check in, 3pm to 5pm Wednesday. Please note, handlers who chose not to move their dogs will not be given any additional time between their runs. If you keep your running order and are back to back, you will have 60 seconds to switch to your next dog.

-----IMPORTANT-----

By entering more than one dog in this event, handlers indicate their acceptance of these rules.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS – Important information - Please Read

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must comply with these at all times. As a competitor it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the latest UK Agility International rules except where stated in the premium.

All dogs and handlers must enter through UK Agility International in order to compete. You must create an account online through the UKI web site www.ukagilityinternational.com.

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of **UK Agility International Rules and Regulations & the West Coast Open Rules** including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry:

Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible to compete in the West Coast Open.

Entries without fees paid in full will be returned. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or guardian if the competitor is a minor. Entering online constitutes a signed entry form.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition if it is: Suffering from any infectious or contagious diseases, interfering with the safety of any person or other animal, likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing. A partial refund may be returned for the above reasons if accompanied by documented proof from a veterinarian or physician. Partial refund will be given of 75% of the entry fees only. RV and crating fees do not apply. This refund must be requested to Ivette White ivette@ukagilityinternational.com with [documentation](#), by 12 PM WST Monday September 19th, 2022.

No refunds will be given after September 19th For ANY REASON.

It is expressly understood that **competitors alone are responsible** for the behavior of their dogs, children and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, may at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. No refunds of fees will be made in such a case. No aggressive dogs are allowed at any UKI event.

No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judges, UKI officials or show managers.

No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.

Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge, the show management reserves the right to appoint another judge. Should circumstances so dictate the show manager, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to UK Agility International. In the event of abandonment of the show through circumstances beyond our control, the show management may defray such expenses from the entry fee to cover the cost of the show preparation. These accounts will then be made public.

All dogs are entered at this show at their owner's risk and while every care will be taken, the show management and/or UKI will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury however caused to dogs, persons or property while at the show.

All competitors **MUST** clean up after their dogs at all times. Failure to do so will result in competitors being asked to leave the show.

Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. **There will be a \$30.00 service charge for returned checks.** Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made before a competitor may compete. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls to a UK Agility International account must be paid prior to the start of the event. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice shall be reported to UK Agility International. UK Agility International will suspend a dog's/handler's registration until fees are paid in full.

Media Rights Release: Through the entry into this event, all competitors grant to UKI and its affiliated companies, representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or

media known now or in the future. Further, I hereby release UKI and its affiliates, representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.

Rules of Conduct: UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors, officials, and event personnel shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions.

Each competitor acknowledges through their entry to the West Coast Open that their participation in the event is a privilege and not a right. By virtue of their entry in the event, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI rules and regulations, and agree to accept any sanctions that may be imposed for failure to comply. The judge has sole responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to excuse a dog and competitor from the ring based on matters related to competitor misconduct. The UKI head officials have sole responsibility for determining when an infraction should result in expulsion of a competitor, manager, or other team official from the event and/or from future events.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the judge or UKI officials may take action: Abuse of a dog on the grounds · Actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog · Willful misconduct or interference with a competitor's right to show · Any acts of poor sportsmanship · Violation of procedural rules · Compulsive, correctional training on the grounds · Willful misrepresentation on entry forms · Willful misrepresentation of animals · Dog aggression · Failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog. · Intimidation and/or impolite confrontation of judges, event officials, event helpers, or other competitors · Creating excessive delays as a failure to respect the authority of event officials. In addition, a social media code of conduct is in effect. Cyber bullying of any kind towards event management, UKI, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand and comments that try to incite further issues. Any of these cases may sanction removal from the social media page and even lead to expulsion of the event and even further expulsion of organization membership.

Event Entry Refund Policy BEFORE the closing date: Entries will not be accepted, changed or altered after the closing date or once the event entry limit has been met. There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn nor in the event a dog and/or handler is dismissed from the competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal providing this was within accordance of UK Agility International rules and regulations. A full refund is available for any membership that is not older than 14 days from the creation of the account date. There will be no cost if refund money is to be left in your UK Agility International account. If money is to be returned then the following administration costs will be incurred: 1) If payment was received by check or money order then a \$6 administration fee will be incurred; 2) If payment was received from a credit card, a 5% charge of the refund will be assessed, per transaction. Once the event has closed or reached its limit, refunds of any kind for any reason will not be available apart from that specified above in relation to documented proof from a veterinarian or physician. RV & Crating are excluded from this policy.

Bitches in season may compete at the event. A mat must be used on the start line provided by the show management however the handler is responsible for notifying the ring of the need for the mat. You must notify the event management at check-in if your dog is in season or as soon as this happens during the event. Competitors must note this on check-in board if running orders have already been produced. As to not to give BIS an advantage, they will continue to run at their assigned run order placement. This allowance is in concurrence with UKI rules.

In the event of extraordinary circumstances outside of the event management's control, the event show management team reserve the right to alter the scheduling and event rules.

All Judges' decisions are final. Absolutely no video review or video challenge is permitted by the competitor. Please be sure you understand the Rules of Conduct explained above. No handler may approach a judge to question a call either during, immediately after or anytime throughout the event. Any calls in question, the competitor must only ask the Ring Manager.
